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SURVEY METHODOLOGY

The survey results are based on 1,001 telephone interviews, conducted from August 17 to 28, 2006 as part of a CROP-express omnibus survey. Of these respondents, 599 were part of the working population.¹

Respondents were selected at random from among persons 18 years of age and over living in selected households and able to answer questions in French or in English. No substitutions of households or respondents were allowed. A probabilistic approach was used to select the household sample from telephone customers across Quebec.

Interviews were carried out from the CROP call centre in Montreal. The geographical distribution of respondents was as follows: 501 in Greater Montreal, 200 in Greater Quebec City and 300 from elsewhere in Quebec.

During the compilation process, the results were weighted according to gender, age, region of residence and language most often spoken at home, using data obtained from the Statistics Canada 2001 census to reflect the distribution of the adult population in Quebec.

Statistically, a sample of this size (n=1,001) is accurate within 3 percentages points, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error increases by 4% for the workers sub-sample.

SUMMARY OF RESULTS

Survey population

- The survey was conducted among 1,001 Quebecers, interviewed between August 17 and 28, 2006. Of this sample, 599 respondents were part of the working population.
- The vast majority (85%) worked full-time (30 or more hours/week) and 83% were salaried employees.
- For analysis purposes, these 599 respondents were broken down into age groups or generations, i.e. 18-28 years (16%), 29-43 years (41%), 44-60 years (41%) and 61 years and over (2%).

General attitude

- Overall, nine respondents out of ten said they were very (50%) or somewhat (42%) satisfied with current job.
 - No significant differences were noted between the different generations or between salaried employees and self-employed workers.

Scale of values

- A large majority (96%) of those interviewed considered work to be an important value, with 47% ranking it as "very important," and 49% as "somewhat important."
 - The slight percentage difference (nuance à traduire) between "very" and "somewhat" important indicates that respondents who are very satisfied with their job also consider their work to be very important (58% compared to an average 47%).
- To determine where Quebec workers place work on their scale of values, respondents were asked to rank it along with six other factors. **Family** took first place, with 91% claiming **family** to be "very important" in their lives.

At 47%, work placed fifth out of the seven values, trailing family (91%), a sense of responsibility (84%), respect of authority (55%), leisure activities (53%), but ahead of career (32%) and money (28%).

The survey also showed that:

- 44% who said they were not very or not at all satisfied with their job felt that money was very important, compared to 28% of all respondents;
- 64% of those who were very satisfied with their job ranked respect of authority as a very important value (compared to an average 55%);
- career was considered to be very important by 44% of the 18-to-28 age group and by 41% of those who were "very satisfied" with their job (compared to an average 32%).

Attitudes toward work: motivation

- ➤ The large majority (90-95%) of respondents are motivated by their job:
 - 95% totally (68%) or somewhat (27%) agreed with the statement "In my job, I feel motivated to give the best I can"
 - 92% said they liked their work: 64% a great deal, 29% somewhat;
 - nine out of ten respondents totally agreed (56%) or somewhat agreed (35%) with the statement "My job gives me a feeling of personal fulfillment";
 - only 41% totally (20%) or somewhat (21%) agreed with the statement "I consider work as a source of income, not a place to get personal satisfaction"; and
 - most salaried employees felt very (59%) or somewhat (34%) motivated by the desire to contribute to the success and achievement of the objectives of the company where they are employed;
 - o No significant differences in attitudes towards motivation were noted between the different generations.

Corporate image and reputation

- Nine out of ten respondents were proud (totally 60%, somewhat 31%) to work for their current employer, the most enthusiastic being those who are very satisfied with their job.
- Eight out of ten totally (52%) or somewhat (28 %) planned on working for a long time for their current employer.

- A majority of the respondents (89%) respect authority, although not all to the same degree: 43% totally agreed with the statement "I always respect the decisions taken by management, as long as they are ethical, even when I don't agree with these decisions," while 46% agreed somewhat.
- Lastly, 53% of the salaried employees CROP interviewed would be prepared to switch to another employer at any time if they were offered better work conditions: 30% totally agreed with this statement and 23%, somewhat agreed.
 - The percentage of respondents agreeing with this statement tended to decrease with age, dropping from 67% for the 18-to-28 age group and to 27% for those over 60.

Retirement

- Slightly more than one-third (36%) of salaried employees work for organizations where their employer makes no contribution to their retirement. A comparable percentage (35%) work for an employer who offers a private retirement plan, and 24% for an employer who contributes to their RRSP.
- The average expected retirement age is 61.5. Analysis of the results indicate that self-employed workers plan to retire a little later (63.7) than salaried employees (61.1).
